Thrive offers a trauma-informed, whole school or setting approach that helps to improve the mental health and wellbeing of children and young people.

At Mulberry Park, we are a Thrive school and use it as a whole school approach for all of our children.

The Thrive approach uses strategies and activities with the children, so they feel safe, supported and ready to learn.



This term, we are continuing to develop our knowledge of our Zones of Regulation to support our personal, social and emotional learning in school. This term we began by revisiting and then have focused on a concept per fortnight.
